

Cabin Rules

Please help us continue to offer this unique experience to the visitors of Palisade State Park by complying with these rules.

- ❖ **Leave it the way you found it:** Unfortunately, we do not have the resources to treat the cabins like hotel rooms. You are responsible for light cleaning and removing all garbage from the cabin, the same as you would do in a campsite.
- ❖ **There is NO SMOKING in the cabins:** Please be considerate of the people who will stay after you and smoke outside on the deck.
- ❖ **Pets are not allowed:** Due to the fact that pets shed and leave a mess, pets are not allowed inside or around cabins.
- ❖ **You may not move furniture outside:** Our furniture is indoor quality only and can be ruined by weathering of all sorts. We recommend you set up your own camp chairs on the deck.
- ❖ **There is no cooking allowed in the cabins with exception of the microwave:** Cooking causes grease spills, burnt furniture and lasting odors. Food also attracts small animals. Cabins are made of wood and cooking inside increases fire danger.
- ❖ **Fires must be in designated areas only:** All fires, including charcoal, must be in existing grills or in a metal container at least 16 inches off the ground. All open fires should be extinguished if left unattended. Do not gather firewood in the park.
- ❖ **Keep your area clean:** Dumpsters for garbage are provided in the area. Keeping a clean area will minimize things such as flies during the day or an unexpected visit from a skunk or raccoon during the night.
- ❖ **Cabin Capacity is eight people:** Too many people cause destruction, so please stay within capacity. There is a two car maximum per cabin.
- ❖ **There are no additional camp units when staying in the cabins:** Camper trailers in the parking lot or pitch tents around the cabin are not allowed. Additional campsites must be purchased.
- ❖ **Individuals under 16 years of age must be directly supervised by an adult over 21 years of age:** It is our experience that kids enjoy jumping on furniture, twisting knobs and poking holes. Please do not leave your children unattended.

SAFETY: These cabins are located in the mountains so please be aware of snakes, other reptiles, and wild animals.
