CELEBRATION AT FREMONT INDIAN STATE PARK AND MUSEUM
NEW SAM STOWE GROUP-USE AREA

Sevier– Fremont Indian State Park and Museum celebrates the opening of the Sam Stowe Group-Use Area Saturday, June 13 from noon to 4 p.m. with a ceremonial ribbon cutting at 2 p.m. This event is free and open to the public.

This event coincides with Celebrate the Wild. Activities for children and families are scheduled throughout the day and include tours of the native plant garden, open air demonstrations, and presentations by the Fremont Chapter of the Native Plant Society of Utah.

The Sam Stowe Group-Use Area is an ideal location for family, group, business, and church outings. The area may be reserved for either day or overnight use. Facilities include:

- Accommodations for up to 100 people
- A campground with sites for RVs and tents, including seven full-hookup sites
- Full restrooms with coin operated showers
- Two pavilions with electricity, lights and barbeque grills
- Volleyball court
- Two horseshoe pits
- ATV ride in/out access from group-use area (No other riding allowed)
- Coming soon: An amphitheater, basketball court and archery range

Fremont Indian State Park and Museum offers mountain bike rentals, a gift shop with handcrafted jewelry from area American Indians, access to the Paiute ATV trail, nearby hiking, fishing, and a native plant garden.
